



Your Spooky Shedd Pumpkin Template

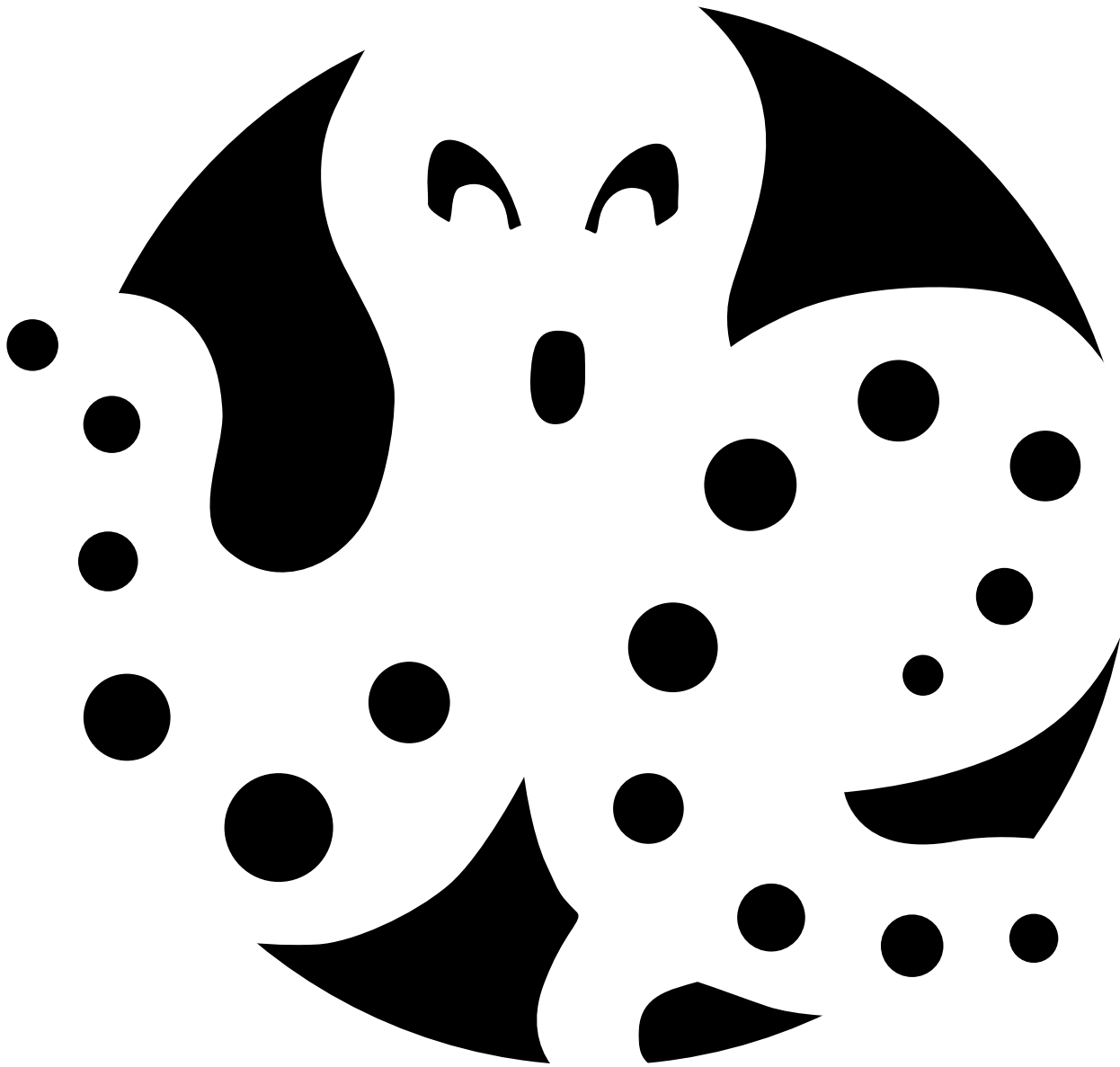


Instructions

Print your favorite pumpkin stencil on a sheet of 8.5 x 11-inch paper. If you want to adjust the size of the stencil, enlarge or reduce it using a photocopier. Once you've cut a lid in the pumpkin and scooped out insides (and saved the seeds to roast!), tape the stencil to the "face" side. Using a nail, outline the stencil by poking holes through the paper and into the pumpkin skin. Then use a pumpkin-carving saw to cut along the dotted lines.
