



Friday Flicks

Summer Reading Club Begins

The Children's Room at the Henry Waldinger Memorial Library is planning a very active summer reading program this year. Our aim is to encourage kids to read and to celebrate the joy of books. This year's summer reading club theme is **"On Your Mark, Get Set ... READ!"** and we are sponsoring the following Summer Reading Programs:

- **LITTLE CHAMPS** is the reading club for babies and toddlers, birth to pre-K. Parents/caregivers must read approximately 18 books and/or engage in early literacy skills with their little ones (3 books per week).
- **MOST VALUABLE PLAYERS** is the reading club for emergent readers, grades K-2. Parents/caregivers and children must share 12 books (2 books per week).

- **HALL OF FAMERS** is the program for children who are reading independently, grades 3-6. Children must read 6 books (1 book per week).

Prizes will be awarded to participants along the way, and Certificates of Achievement will be given to those who complete the program. There will be three final shows this year – one musical program with Darlene Graham for children up to Kindergarten and two animal programs presented by Jason Reilly for children grades 1 and up.

In addition, the Adult Room is sponsoring the **“Get in the Game ... READ!” Young Adult Summer Reading Club** for students in Grades 7-12. Students must read 3 books. They will receive incentive prizes, Certificates of Achievement, etc.

New Mobile App

Nassau public libraries, including the Henry Waldinger Memorial Library, have launched a new mobile app which will allow library users to have access to the library in the palm of their hands. The new app, compatible with Apple devices and most Androids, is available for free download. Users have the ability to search for materials, view events and

programs, and find additional information about library services. After Valley Stream has been chosen as the home library, the app will be customized to Valley Stream for easy convenience.



Users can search for movies, books, etc. Audio and e-books can be downloaded directly to the mobile device for instant access. The app features a user-friendly interface for patrons to take advantage of all that the library offers. For example, through the “Museum Passes” portal, patrons can visit a library webpage to view a list of available museum passes. Another key component, the research button, sends users to online resources and homework help. Patrons have the ability to view their checked-out items and holds and other features. Users can select to receive notifications about library news and account status.



Interactive Library Online Calendar

The library maintains an interactive online calendar of

events through Eventkeeper. Click on the calendar link on our webpage to see what is going on at the library.



The details about each event are listed, or you can get a weekly list or a monthly calendar of events. You can send have a reminder sent to yourself 24 hours before an event, and you can share an event with a friend.
