It's Like a HEAT WAVE!

Tips to Keep Cool & Healthy



Summertime is an ideal time to enjoy the outdoors and experience all the natural beauty the Ozarks has to offer. However, since we've been experiencing frequent heat advisories, it is critical for your health to stay safe and hydrated. According to the American Red Cross, the following tips will help keep your body safe as you enjoy summer-time in the Ozarks:

- **Drink Plenty of Water**—Carry water, juice, or Gatorade with you, and drink continuously even if you don't feel thirsty.
- **Avoid Drinks with Alcohol or Caffeine**—They can make you feel better briefly, but they make the heat's effect on your body worse.
- **Apply Sunscreen**—Use sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or more.
- **Eat Small Meals**—Eat frequent, small meals consisting of carbohydrates, salads, and fruit. Avoid foods that are high in protein because they increase metabolic heat.
- **Slow Down**—Reduce or reschedule strenuous activity. If you must engage in the activity, do so during the early morning hours.
- **Wear Loose, Lightweight, and Light-Colored Clothing**—Light colors reflect heat and sunlight and help you maintain a healthy body temperature.

Break Time for Nursing Mothers

In accordance with the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA), employees will receive reasonable time to express breast milk for her nursing child for one year after the child's birth. For the purposes of this policy, a nursing

mother refers to any employee who has given birth within the last year and is breast-feeding her newborn child. A nursing mother should work with her supervisor to determine the best way to accommodate both her nursing needs and the responsibilities of her job.

Double-Check Time Sheets for Accuracy

Before you submit your time sheet to your manager, make sure you have recorded all information correctly, including vacation time, sick days, and the total days and hours worked.

Supervisors: Before submitting your departments time sheets to HR, make sure they are accurate and complete with your signature.

Beth's office is a hub of activity—she is responsible for daily deposits, renewing client memberships, and processing nearly all work for the O.C. before sending it to City Hall.

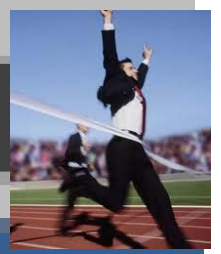
Beth looks forward to each day at the OC...
