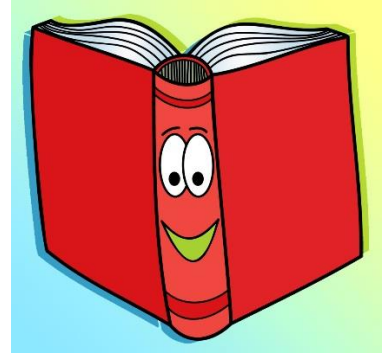

# Cereal Box Book Report



**Task:** *Create and decorate a real cereal box with illustrations and information related to the fiction book you read.*

**Due Date:** *Monday, November 3rd*

**Front of Box:** Use a piece of white or light colored paper to cover the front of your cereal box. You will want to create the cover before gluing it on your box. Include the name of the cereal and a picture. Invent a name for the cereal that is related to the title of the book and sounds like a cereal. Do not use the exact title of the book. Choose a shape for the cereal as well as colors and ingredients that all relate to the book.

For example, for the book, The Cat in the Hat, you might invent a cereal called Crunch Cats, a toasted oat cereal in the shape of miniature hats.

**Right Side of Box:** Make a list of ingredients that include the story elements that follow.

***Characters and Setting:*** Under the heading, "ingredients," list the main characters and write a sentence about each one. Then describe the setting. You can use the template on the attached sheet.

**Back Side of Box** (top half): Write a summary that describes the main problem and solution of the book. Try to use words that will "grab" the reader's attention and make him want to buy your cereal. You can use the attached template or do this in your own way.

**Back Side of Box** ( bottom half): Design a game that is based on the story. It can be a puzzle, word search, word scramble, maze, crossword puzzle, hidden pictures illustrations, or any other fun activity that might be found on the back of a cereal box. Make sure it includes information from the book.

**Top of Box**: Include the title, author, number of pages, and number of stars you would give this book if you were a book critic. The maximum number of stars your book could earn would be 5. You can use the template or create the top of the box yourself as long as you include all of the things listed above.

### **Characters:**

List the main characters and write a sentence about each one. For example, if you were using the story, "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory," you might include the following characters:

Charlie Bucket: He is a poor boy who finds the last golden ticket and wins a trip to Willy Wonka's Chocolate Factory.

Willy Wonka: He is the lively owner of the chocolate factory who allows six children and a member of their family to spend a day at his magical factory.

### **Setting:**

Use complete sentences to tell where the story takes place. You may find that there is more than one setting in the story. For example, if you were using the story, "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory", you might write:

The beginning of the story takes place in Charlie Bucket's very small house that he shares with his large family. Once Charlie finds the golden ticket and wins the contest, the rest of the story takes place in Willy Wonk's amazing chocolate factory.
