Job Title: *Senior Accountant*

Position Summary: The Senior Accountant will maintain the integrity of the General Ledger reporting system by ensuring that all journal entries are posted in a timely manner, assist with annual audit, prepare annual tax schedules & ensure subsidiary ledgers and journals are closed in accordance with established procedures and maintain compliance with grants.

Essential Job Functions: Through employee's own efforts, employee is responsible for accomplishing the following accurately and timely:

- Supervises subordinate staff
- Maintains general ledger
- Closes books monthly
- Assumes responsibility for the financial reporting and assisting with audit
- Creates and maintains the budget
- Performs financial analysis
