	30-27	<b>Excellent to Very Good:</b> Knowledgeable, substantive development of thesis, relevant to assigned topic	
	26-22	<b>Good to Average:</b> sure knowledge of subject, adequate range, limited development of thesis, mostly relevant to topic, but lacks detail	
	21-17	<b>Fair:</b> limited knowledge of subject, little substance, inadequate development of topic	
	16-13	<b>Needs Much Improvement:</b> does not show knowledge of subject, not many details, not relevant to assigned topic OR not enough to evaluate.	
		<b>Organization</b>	
	20-18	<b>Excellent to Very Good:</b> fluent expression, ideas clearly stated/supported, succinct, well-organized, logical sequencing, cohesive	
	17-14	<b>Good to Average:</b> somewhat choppy, loosely organized, but main ideas stand out, limited support, logical but incomplete sequencing	
	13-10	<b>Fair:</b> non-fluent, ideas are confusing or	

		disconnected, lacks logical sequencing and development	
	9-7	<b><u>Needs Much Improvement:</u></b> does not communicate, no organization OR not enough to evaluate	
		<b>Vocabulary and Language Use</b>	
	20-18	<b><u>Excellent to Very Good:</u></b> sophisticated range, effective word/idiom choice and usage, word form mastery	
	17-14	<b><u>Good to Average:</u></b> adequate range, occasional errors of word/idiom form, choice, usage but meaning understood	
	13-10	<b><u>Fair:</u></b> limited range, frequent errors of word/idiom form, choice, usage, meaning somewhat confusing or not understood	
	9-7	<b><u>Needs Much Improvement:</u></b> essentially translation, little knowledge of English vocabulary, idioms, word form OR not enough to evaluate	
		<b>Grammar Usage</b>	
	25-22	<b><u>Excellent to Very Good:</u></b> effective, complex sentences, few errors of agreement, tense, number, word order/function, articles, pronouns, prepositions	
	21-18	<b><u>Good to Average:</u></b> effective, but simple sentence construction, minor problems in complex constructions, several errors of agreement, tense, number, word order/function, articles, pronouns, prepositions, but meaning understood	
	17-11	<b><u>Fair:</u></b> major problems in simple/complex sentences, many errors of agreement, tense, number, word order, articles, pronouns, prepositions and/or fragments, run-ons, deletions, meaning confused or not understood	
	10-5	<b><u>Needs Much Improvement:</u></b> almost no mastery of sentence construction rules, many errors, ideas not understood OR not enough to evaluate	
		<b>Mechanics</b>	
	5	<b><u>Excellent to Very Good:</u></b> few errors of spelling, punctuation, capitalization, paragraphing	

	4	<b><u>Good to Average:</u></b> some errors of spelling, punctuation, capitalization, paragraphing, but meaning understood	
	3	<b><u>Fair:</u></b> frequent errors of spelling, punctuation, capitalization, paragraphing, poor typing, meaning confused or not understood	
	2	<b><u>Needs Much Improvement:</u></b> many errors of spelling, punctuation, capitalization, paragraphing, typing is poor, OR not enough to evaluate
