POSITION SUMMARY

The School Adjustment Counselor is responsible for supporting the social and emotional well being of all students in order to achieve academic success. The School Adjustment Counselor is a key member of the Student Support Team and works directly with the Assistant Principal to ensure a safe and positive school climate. The School Adjustment Counselor is a full time position and reports directly to the Health and Wellness Coordinator.

EXPECTATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Ensure a Safe and Positive School Climate:

- Serve as a member of the School Safety Committee
- Support and facilitate restorative circles as a response to various school/classroom climate concerns
- Coordinate special programs and events for students related to character development and leadership

Serve as a Member of Grade Level and Health & Wellness Teams:

- Serve as a member of Grade-Level teams

- Assist faculty in understanding the complete range of services available to students to support their academic and socials emotional success and match students with services as appropriate
- Coordinate school-home communication for students with social, emotional, and medical concerns
- Monitor student absenteeism and provide outreach to families for students with truancy concerns
- Monitor implementation of interventions of school interventions for students

Provide Targeted Supports for High-Needs Students:

- Counsel students experiencing personal challenges
- Lead clinical and psycho-educational support groups for students, such as DBT, grief or anger management groups
- In conjunction with the Director of Learning Services, coordinate psychological and socials emotional services for special education students, including weekly student checks ins
- In conjunction with the Principal and Horizontal Team Leaders, refer students for academic intervention services
- Coordinate communication and services with outside agencies & programs
- In conjunction with the nurse, screen students and coordinate family communication for those suspected of self-injury or being under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Support students in crisis intervention

QUALIFICATIONS

- Masters degree required, MSW or LCSW/LICSW preferred
- Three years experience working with youth or in social services preferred
- Excellent time management skills, including the ability to triage/prioritize competing needs
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills, including ability to communicate effectively with students and families of diverse backgrounds
- Ability to de-escalate highly emotional students and adults
- A commitment to the belief that all children can succeed

Preference will be given to applicants with demonstrated experience and expertise in implementing multi-tiered systems of academic and/or behavioral support.
