Using virtual apps and desktops that clinicians can access from anywhere, on any device.

Within trust premises, clinicians and staff can access their apps and desktops on thin-client terminals. The solution uses single sign-on technology and terminals are equipped with RFID readers that allow users to tap their identity badges on the reader to instantly access their desktop session. With application management used to control user profiles and policies and dynamically provide a seamless user experience.

This is not just about technology as an enabler. It's not just about putting in faster machines. The desktop technology has changed the way our clinicians work. Staff can access high-definition, 3-D diagnostic quality images and all this is achieved with a single, non-persistent desktop image.

### **Implementing a healthcare logistics management platform - tracking health records on our journey to an EPR**

Barking Havering and Redbridge University Hospitals NHS Trust has implemented a tracking solution to manage health records using fixed RFID readers installed throughout the hospital and handheld devices that track down specific files like a metal detector. Using iFIT™ from 6PM, the Trust ensured the double dividend benefit of significantly reducing the number of missing medical records while improving clinical services and patient safety through automatic real-time information. Location information has helped eliminate many laborious filing processes such as time spent manually looking for records. Together with automation of tracking procedures the Trust has released 20% of physical space and vastly reduced the labour effort for health records staff. Benefits also include a reduction in department overheads and better security through improved auditability making a valuable contribution to IG toolkit requirements. The system has also introduced GS1 through clever bar code technology responding to Lord Carter of Coles.

University Hospital Southampton NHS Foundation Trust has developed a 'patient online service' to share patient information between care providers and patient, using a secure electronic interface. A pilot for Prostate Cancer follow up patients has been very successful: many patients now have their condition monitored by clinicians remotely, preventing numerous face to face appointments, yet still in compliance with the national clinical framework. Patient feedback has been positive, and the system provides effective communication without detriment to clinical care. UHS is now building this system into commissioner contracts for a wide range of appropriate patient cohorts, to enhance care, transform services and bring greater efficiency. Fiona Boyle and colleagues will share the findings of the clinical, technological, and contractual journey.

## STREAM ONE The Dudley Digital Trust Programme

Dudley Group of Hospitals has recently started a 10 year Digital Trust programme, following three key principles:

**Record:** deliver high-quality healthcare that is paper-free at the point-of-care

**Support:** give clinicians all the information they need to make clinical decisions with the patient

**Share:** enable appropriate clinical information to be shared with patients and other healthcare professionals

Simply putting in technology, without a review of its implementation and effectiveness, will not be effective. We recently implemented an out-of-hours task management system to improve patient safety and junior doctor workload, and achieved over 90% of electronic discharge summaries sent within 24 hours to the patients GP. We have taken a whole systems approach, overcoming the technical, clerical and clinical barriers that were preventing benefits from being fully realised. Ultimately, with clinicians and the IT team working together, we were able to deliver successful projects that have improved patient care.

### Key messages:

Keep it simple for the end user, otherwise they will find another way

Involve clinicians and IT in the design and review of the project

Monitor performance at every stage

As part of improving safety and efficiency, the Department of Health have embarked on a programme of work to implement 'Scan for Safety' across the NHS. North Tees & Hartlepool NHS Trust were selected as an early adopter for this programme of work and have successfully implemented stage 1 of the project with a view to completing the detailed programme by October 2017.

The outcome of the work will enable an efficient way of recording the drugs, equipment and implants used on patients by utilising standard GS1 barcoding and scanning this information in to a patient's record. Each product used, member of staff administering treatment, each patient and the location where treatment is administered will all have a unique barcode. The scanning of this information will allow the relevant details to be recorded in the Electronic Patients Record, the stock management system and the payment system to give total automation for the recording of information, total traceability for the recall of products and more timely and accurate information for clinical decision making. This will improve patients safety and the efficiency of the NHS going forward.

We will share with you the progress made to date, the challenges we have had to overcome and the next stages of the programme the NHS is embarking on.

### Reducing mortality at weekends – through 7 day working

There is a variation in care depending upon time of the day and the day of the week patients are admitted with increased risk of death associated with weekend emergency admissions. There is an alarming scaling down of services during weekends in acute trusts. Where there is a 7 day service, there is no observed difference in mortality rates in the week and at weekend. Mortality rate for weekend admissions is significantly higher among trusts with the fewest doctors. More senior staff per bed at weekends is associated with a lower weekend emergency mortality rate.

Increased senior clinician (doctors and nurses) presence over the weekend is a cost effective model. It reduces mortality, facilitates early decision making, reduces unnecessary investigations, reduces length of stay, reduces admission/ readmission and improves supervision of trainees. If the full benefits of 7 day Consultant service are to be realised, support services will also need to adopt 7 day working practice.
