Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA)

The requested information will be used to determine your skills and experience, as well as your security eligibility for employment with the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency. Routine Uses. In addition to those disclosures generally permitted under 5 U.S.C. 552a(b) of the Privacy Act, these records or information contained therein may specifically be disclosed outside the Department of Defense as follows: the DoD Blanket Routine Uses set forth at the beginning of the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency's compilation of systems records notices apply to this system. Effect of Failure to Provide the Information: Disclosure of the information requested is voluntary. However, failure to provide the requested will likely result in you not being considered for a position with NGA.

National Security Agency (NSA)

Privacy Act Statement: Authority for collecting information through this website is contained in 10 U.S.C. 1601-1614, 50 U.S.C. 831-835 and 3602-3614; Executive Orders 10450 and 12333, as amended; ICD 704; and DOD Directive 5100.20. DoDs Blanket Routine Uses (found at Appendix 3 of 32 CFR Part 310), as well as the specific uses found in GNSA 02, GNSA 03, GNSA 05, GNSA 08, GNSA 09, and GNSA 10 apply to this information. Authority for requesting your Social Security Number (SSN) is Executive Order 9397, as amended. The requested information will be used to determine your skills and experience, as well as your
