**Opening statement:**  
**Family admitted to hospital following 2 x MI & stroke. Moved to various wards until arriving on speciality.**

Dignity was compromised on many levels but most based around 'FOC'. Such as no hair washing, lack of assistance with nutrition & toileting and becoming incontinent.

Many occasions where problems were communicated to NiC of ward but was different person daily. Ward sister away – no main point of contact.

My uncle felt disrespected, not valued, uncared for and not listened to. Lost his individualism and personality.

Recovery time was increased due to lost motivation.  
Eventually spoke to sister who acted on concerns.

**Punchline**

As a student nurse I saw how compromising his basic human needs was detrimental to his recovery and increased his length of stay. My actions have consequences!
