**STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES (SOP)**

1. **PURPOSE:** To provide guidance, establish policy, and delineate responsibilities for the BOSS Program at Fort Stewart/Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia.
2. **SCOPE:** The Fort Stewart/HAAF BOSS Program is primarily for Single Soldiers of all ranks, to include Single Parents and Geographical Bachelors. BOSS events are open to all Single Soldiers of all ranks, to include Single Parents and Geographical Bachelors.

4. **BACKGROUND:** The objective of the Fort Stewart/HAAF BOSS Program is to establish a working committee of Single Soldiers living on the installation to better and improve the quality of life for Single Soldiers on Fort Stewart/HAAF. It is a DA directed, installation managed, and Soldier operated program. The installation BOSS Program is a Morale, Welfare, and Recreation (MWR) activity that falls under the Directorate of Morale Welfare and Recreation (DMWR) and is managed by the installation BOSS Program Manager. All Army BOSS programs are categorized as a MWR category B program, within the garrison MWR operation entity. At a minimum, the garrison BOSS program will have the following:
  1. A minimum of 50 single Soldiers.
  2. An established non appropriated fund instrumentality (NAFI) or Garrison MWR operating entity.
  3. An assigned MWR advisor.
  4. An assigned senior military advisor.
  5. An established BOSS committee that is made up of:
    - a) The executive council (president, vice president, secretary, treasurer).
