When this is not possible, you must create answers or comments from your imagination, provided they are logically related to information in the text. Be as specific as possible.

Examples of the kind of life events that might be included as major, are:

Events of family (*Names of parents, siblings, how old were you when and if they died, etc.*)

Relationships (*Significant relationships, marriages and children, divorces, etc.*)

Education (*How much? Where and what accomplished?*)

Keep in mind that these examples are not inclusive and that there is a great deal of information that you may include here.

Previous Action.

Briefly describe the major activities your character engaged in during the day of action. Use short phrases.

What is your character's main motivational force? What does your character want most in life? This must not be superficial needs, and need not be tangible. This should relate to the other characters in the play (*relationships*).

Use FANTASY.

Will.

This is your character's relative strength in attaining desires. How strong or weak is your character's inner strength? Is it strong enough to push to the full limit or will the character quickly compromise?

Other.

Add any other pertinent notes or comments about your character that you may not have covered above. These might include any idiosyncrasies, likes and dislikes that may also distinguish your character in some way.
