

DRAFT FOR SHORT FILM PROPOSALS BY STUDENTS FOR BEING BARNARD PROJECT

Introduction:

Being Barnard is proud to announce an exciting opportunity for emerging film makers in the Barnard student community. This is a call for proposals to make a short film, thematically centered around one of the topics listed below. Each submission should address just one of the four topics. Proposals can be submitted by an individual or a group of students. The proposal winners for each film will receive a \$2000 budget to produce the film and a \$500 prize.

Topics:

1. Bystander Intervention-showing Step Up skills in action
2. What does consent look like? What does healthy communication in an intimate encounter look like?
3. Ways to help a friend in a healthy way, being mindful of boundaries.
4. What constitutes a healthy relationship? Addressing both romantic and platonic relationships.

Requirements for all submitted proposals:

1. A 1:00 to 2:00 minute video proposal of your film project. You must include storyboards and a brief synopsis of the plot/script.
 - A. Storyboards should depict basic actions in each scene.
 - B. Synopsis should explain scenes and characters as well as the message intended to be conveyed in the film
2. Proposed Budget for the \$2000.00-see attached spreadsheet to use. Please include a brief narrative explaining each cost. Budget can be printed out or a file on the USB drive.
 - A. Acceptable Items-pre production costs, development costs, filming costs, equipment, actors and participants, filming permits, editing costs
 - B. Unacceptable Items-Craft services (food and beverages), travel costs.
3. The films should take into account the multiple identities of the Barnard community.
4. If the submission is a group submission, the lead of the production team needs to be a Barnard student. If it is an individual student working alone, that person needs to be a Barnard student.
5. All proposals are due by Tuesday, January 19th, 2016.

6. All video proposals must be submitted on a USB drive in .MOV format so that the film can be viewed in Quick Time.

Background to Being Barnard:

Being Barnard is all about thinking critically and engaging with the most dynamic and important issues of the day. Being Barnard is the College's awareness campaign, a holistic approach to ongoing education, created with the input of students and staff. There are many available opportunities for students to gain insight, learn skills, and engage in discussion in the following areas: wellness, relationships, intervention, social identities & social power, and violence education. These opportunities are available through a comprehensive programs offered by Furman Counseling Center, Primary Health Care Services, Well Woman, Student Life, Residential Life, and the Title IX and Equity Office, as well as engaging with programming from SVR, academic offerings, and outside speakers. Parameters for All Final Submissions:

1. All final submissions will be the property of Barnard College. Students can use the final product in their portfolio but the usage of all films will be at the discretion of the college.
2. All final submissions will be able to be used in future trainings on the subjects listed as well as used at special events and on websites.
3. All final films will be no shorter than 4:00 minutes and no longer than 12 minutes.
4. Winners will be announced by Monday, February 1, 2016
5. Final submissions, completed films on a USB drive in MOV format are required to be delivered to PCHS by April 1, 2016.

Criteria for selection will be based on creativity, presenting a message in a clear and engaging way and relevance to the Barnard community. Incomplete submissions will not be considered.
