Volunteering is a great way to learn about giving back to your community, explore interests, and gain new skills. What types of volunteer activities are recognized? You select the volunteer activity you wish to do. The only requirements are that the volunteer is not paid for the activity and that the activity is not court ordered.

Use the Volunteer Log Sheet to record the volunteer activities you perform outside of school so they can be added to your PVSA hours. As you complete a log sheet, parents should assist in updating your hours on the PVSA website. Print a blank log and continue your good work. In April, all of your log sheets are to be submitted to the school. **Please remember – all columns must be completed.**

- Service Activity – What did you do?
- Benefiting Organization – Whom did you do it for?
- Specific Area of Service – Choose from one of the areas at the bottom of the log sheet. If you choose “Other”, please be specific on what your volunteer activity was.
- Date of Service – When did you do it?
- Hours – How long did you spend?
- Approved by (& initials) – Have the person who is certifying your volunteer hours print their name and initial the column. This can be someone from the benefiting organization or a parent.
