This is the time for the set-up of all program and logistics. Key staff will be camping at the park from Tuesday 21st through the weekend to make sure all is completed by Friday and the park back together by Monday the 27th. If you can help us out please let us know.

All concerned can make arrangements to come in during the week and get your areas set-up so that all the big stuff is done by Friday night. Final details you can do Saturday morning but your time will be very limited, it is suggested this be done between 5 and 9am so you do not miss opening ceremonies. At 10am program activity areas open and there will be approx 5000 or more scouts wanting to play.
