MSc. PROJECT MANAGEMENT AND EVALUATION

The graduate programme in Project Management and Evaluation provides management education and training in a much needed area in the Commonwealth Caribbean. The programme responds to the expressed need by Governments, the Private Sector and Development Agencies in the region for a cadre of persons with advanced training in Project Management and Evaluation.

Objectives

The programme is intended to:

- Enhance the institutional capacity of both private and public sector organizations in the developing States of the Caribbean to select and implement projects that represent the best choices for social and economic impact, and for return on stakeholder investment.
- Raise awareness as to why good project management practices are just as relevant and beneficial to service-based organizations – ranging from government, hotels, insurance, telecommunications, and consulting – as they are to product based entities like construction and crafts.
- Raise awareness of the benefits of program monitoring and evaluation and why project managers should make it a routine component of good project management practices.
- Increase the capability of graduates to develop and implement projects that contain clear criteria for success, and ways to measure whether project performance has met its objectives, even when projects are driven by quasi-intangible goals such as social welfare and/or sustainable development.
- Develop in participants the capability to plan, execute, monitor, evaluate, and control their projects through the use of multiple, integrated, quantitative and qualitative project management and evaluation knowledge, skills, tools and techniques, and through the application of this knowledge, skill-sets and tools to real projects embedded throughout the programme.
- Prepare programme participants to set up and appraise projects for possible financing by International Funding Institutions (IFI), and to carry out monitoring and evaluation of such projects for IFI's, the government, and other funding sources.

Entry Requirements

To qualify for entry to this programme, applicants should normally have at least a Second Class Honours degree or its equivalent. Preference will be given in the first instance to persons with work experience in the field of Project Management and/or Project Evaluation. Competence in undergraduate level Statistics course(s) would be a distinct advantage.

Duration

The duration of the programme will normally be 18 months for full-time study and 30 months for part-time study.

Programme Content

The Programme currently consists of thirteen compulsory courses (3 credits each) offered during the Semester, two mandatory workshops (not for credit) which generally take place immediately after Semester 2 examinations, and a Practicum (6 credits) which must be conducted in the final semester of study. The MSc. Project Management and Evaluation is constantly under review to make it more applicable and relevant to the needs of its audience.

Classes will involve lectures, in-depth class discussions reflecting serious critical and analytical thinking, practical assignments that will involve applying theoretical concepts to real situations, and course work and examinations to test understanding of materials taught.
