When using the calculator please keep in mind the following:

- * The formulas presented below assume no child support and insufficient assets for an alimony buy-out.
- * These formulas are provided as guidelines and should not be substituted for critical analysis of the facts of each individual case by qualified counsel.
- * There is not currently any formula enacted or endorsed by the Massachusetts Legislature.
- * The amount of alimony is dependent on the consideration of many factors (as described in M.G.L. c. 208 Section 34).
- * Nevertheless, these formulas have proven to be a valuable resource in helping parties understand a reasonable potential range of spousal support orders.

¹ Net annual income is used for the California and Pennsylvania formulas and the definition varies by jurisdiction. For the purposes of consistency, we suggest using Gross Income less state and federal taxes, FICA, Medicare, Medical Insurance and Union Dues.
