Note to property owners:
As you make your arrangements with a contractor for a construction project, the City of Hendersonville would strongly suggest that you ask the contractor to secure all necessary permits. Whenever a contractor obtains a permit in their name, they are also accepting responsibility for the work. However, when you sign this affidavit you are obtaining a permit(s) in your name for work that will be performed by a contractor that you will be responsible for. Such an arrangement should be avoided if possible. If a permit is issued solely in the name of the property owner, any enforcement action against the contractor for code violations becomes much more difficult. Whenever a contractor applies for a permit, the City will first verify that the contractor is licensed and has a Permit Bond as required by state and local laws. Should the contractor be unwilling to personally obtain the necessary permit(s) it may be an indication they are not property licensed or bonded.
