



MAGADI TOWNSHIP PEST CONTROL PROGRAM – SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work covers the entire area of Magadi Township including but not limited to the listed areas: -

- 680 Housing units (77 of these units have detached SQ's)
- 4 Schools
- 1 Hospital
- 2 Members Club (1 with 4 guest rooms)
- 1 Mosque
- 4 Church buildings
- 1 Market Cluster (Comprising of 26 Jointed market stalls)

- 2 Butcheries

- 1 Hotel
- Police Station
- Post Office
- 1 Banking facility (FOSA) and related offices
- 119 Company Office spaces & conferencing facilities (Office kitchens, stores/Achieves included)

KAJIADO UNITS PEST CONTROL

70 units that needs pest control this includes treatment against crawling animals like snakes

MOMBASA UNITS PEST CONTROL

Shade 9 and 10 Storage, changing rooms, all offices within the company premises and waiting bays.

Infestation: Fumigation of bedbugs, termites, cockroaches, mosquitoes and other associated pests

The contractor has to Provide qualified pest control specialist.

TYPE OF PESTS

The main pests to be controlled are cockroaches and mosquitoes. Where necessary, control of other pests such as bees, Ants, wasps, snakes, rodents etc, and all other species of flying insects, and crawling animals that may appear from time to time may be covered.

FREQUENCY OF TREATMENT

Quarterly

TREATMENT PROGRAMME

The Township Office will issue a program to be followed when carrying out the treatment, and a guide who will accompany the spray team to areas to be treated as per the program.

NEGLIGENCE

The service provider will meet the cost of damages to any equipment or item in a house or office, damaged as a result of poor handling of spray.

TIMMINGS FOR TREATMENT

Between 7.30am and 5.30pm. Other facilities such as clubs and eateries can agree on appropriate timings.

SAFETY AND HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Clearly identify the type and concentration of chemicals to be used for each pest identified

Provide MSDS for all the chemicals to be used

Training documents for staff to undertake the fumigation exercise

List of PPE you intend to use

Provide schedule of the pest control exercise

Preferential to chemicals that are environmentally safe
