Owensboro Health Foundation's 20th Annual Golf Classic will be held at The Pearl Club on Thursday, June 10, 2021, and will benefit the Foundation's mission to heal the sick and to improve the health of our community. Proceeds from this event are used to fund many health-related programs and services for patients and their families in our 18-county service area.

Tournament Format

This year's scramble will be a 4-person team format. No handicaps are involved. There will be two shotgun starts. The morning shotgun will start at 7:30 a.m. and the afternoon shotgun will begin at 1:00 p.m. with an awards ceremony at the end of the day. The standard entry fee is \$250 per person or \$1000 per team, and includes player gifts, breakfast, lunch, course food and beverages, dinner, prizes and FUN. We also offer a live leaderboard accessible by mobile phone throughout each round.



While our special events were cancelled and fundraising deeply impacted, we have been able to fund some incredible projects to help ease the burden of our patients and family members. When no visitors were allowed in the hospital, we made sure patients received flower delivery to brighten their room, Care Bears to bring them comfort, or cozy socks to let them know we cared. We purchased universal phone chargers so they could keep their phones charged and virtually stay connected to their loved ones at home. We bought I-pads for our team members to show translated Covid-19 related safety precaution videos to the non-English speaking members of our community. We made sure our home-bound elderly patients received necessities for daily living. We paid for our families with newborn babies in the NICU to stay at a nearby hotel when our Hospitality Suites were closed.

These efforts reflect our everyday mission to develop volunteerism and philanthropy to heal the sick and improve the health of our communities. We are so proud to meet so many needs of our patients, their families and our community. Please join us as we work to help the thousands of people in our community who need us. The need is greater than ever before. Your support makes our work possible, and you are truly appreciated.

Since its inception, the Foundation has supported numerous Owensboro Health projects impacting the lives of the people in our region. **In Fiscal Year 2020, 17,726 of our family members, friends and neighbors benefited through the following funded programs:**



Programs & Services List

- Art Cart, provides varied activities for patients and visitors
- Baby Boxes for Infants in Need, provides baby essentials for new mothers to get them through their first few days at home from the hospital
- Backpacks for Homeless, provides backpacks for homeless to carry necessary medications
- Behavioral Health Music Therapy, enables music to be played in each patient room to aid with therapy
- Bike Helmets and Education, provides bicycle helmet, as well as helmet fitting and education, to the pediatric population (15 years of age and younger) at Owensboro Health public events in our region to reduce traumatic brain injuries
- Breast Cancer Assistance Fund, provides financial assistance to breast cancer patients who cannot afford specialty bras and/or medicines needed for controlling or relieving symptoms
- Buckle Up for Life Program
- Camp Wheeze Away, an educational day camp provided for children with asthma
- Car Seat Assistance and Education Program, and Car Seat Passenger Restraint Technician Training Certification
- Care Bears for Kids, provides stuffed animals to comfort children admitted to the Owensboro Health emergency department, surgery or pediatrics
- Clinical Education Apollo Nursing Simulator, provides interactive experiences to mimic realistic scenarios to teach best practices in patient care and safety
- Dr. Scott E. Gaines Scholarship Fund, provides scholarships for college-bound students from Hopkins County
- Healthpark Car Seat Assistance Fund, provides free car seats to families in need
- Healthpark Fall Proof Program, equipment for the Owensboro Health Healthpark to pilot a community-based fall prevention program
- Healthpark Prevent T2, diabetes prevention program
- Healthpark Run for Your Life, kids fun run
- Heat Preventive Illness Program, equipment and supplies to assist sports trainers in treating high-school and college athletes for heat-related illness during sporting events
- Home Health Phototherapy Equipment, provides phototherapy equipment to treat jaundice in infant patients at home instead of inpatient
- HOPE Fund, "Helping Our People in Emergencies," provides financial, emotional, and spiritual support to employees of Owensboro Health facing crises and emergency situations
- Infant Bereavement Gowns, provides hand sewn infant bereavement gowns to expectant families who suffer the loss of their child
- Lifeline Program, monitoring devices for elderly and low income
- Mammograms for Life, provides free breast health services (including screening mammograms, diagnostic mammograms, ultrasounds, biopsies, MRIs and pathology) to medically underserved women
- LifeSpring, provides a combination of coping and sharing, health and wellness, education, and creative and complementary therapies for cancer survivors and anyone in our service area affected by a cancer diagnosis
- Medication Fund, provides financial assistance to cancer patients who cannot afford the medicines needed for controlling or relieving symptoms
- Oncology Conference, annual educational event for medical professionals that provides information and updates on trends in staging, diagnosis and treatments of predominant cancers in our area
- Transportation Fund, a fund that provides mileage reimbursement to low-income cancer patients who must travel to the cancer center multiple times per week for treatment
- Mother/Baby Smart Crib Cooling Cradle, cooling cradle lowers temperature of demised babies slowing decomposition process and enabling additional time with families
- NICHE Hearing Amplifiers, provides hearing amplifiers to patients as needed so they may hear and better understand their care
- Kangaroo Care Chairs, chairs specifically designed to promote this skin-to-skin experience for preterm babies, and recline to the most appropriate position to reduce stress and provide comfort and security
- Monitors, equipping two additional rooms in the NICU with specialized equipment to match the pace, unique needs and critical nature of the unit

- Neopuffs and NAVA software, Neopuff T-Piece Infant Resuscitators, allow healthcare providers to manually provide immediate pressure-controlled respiratory assistance to babies; NAVA software connects a baby's own nervous system to the ventilator, so the breathing assistance provided through the ventilator is provided in proportion to and in sync with the baby's own respiratory efforts
- NicView, equipping all 20 of the licensed level III NICU single-family rooms at Owensboro Health Regional Hospital with a camera at each isolette and a secure web-based video stream so that parents and family members can see their NICU babies from any device connected to the Internet
- Portable Amplitude-Integrated EEG Monitor, provides simplified monitoring of brain function of pre-term babies for 24 hours or more, allowing easier observation and review by medical staff
- Shuttle, allows infant to be placed in their isolette immediately after delivery, allowing for more persistent thermoregulation
- Ultrasound, aids umbilical venous (UVC) and umbilical arterial (UAC) catheters insertion in sick preterm and term neonates at the bedside reducing exposure to X-rays and decreasing time in treatment
- Vein Visualization, aids needle insertion in sick preterm and term neonates to reduce the number of sticks
- Owensboro Health Network Patient Assistance Program, assists indigent patients in the outpatient setting in obtaining the services needed to maintain optimal health, including transportation, medical supplies and medications
- Parkinson's Disease Support Group, offers information, support and activities for those affected by Parkinson's Disease and their families
- Pastoral Care Tea for the Soul, provides reflection and self-care practices for OH staff
- Pediatric Accessibility, provides step stools, child-size toilet seats, IV bag covers and pediatric-themed supplies to the unit
- Pediatric Bedside Gaming Units, provides pediatric patients educational gaming at the bedside
- Pediatric Emergency Education, increases the clinical knowledge and expertise of nursing staff related to caring for emergently ill children through didactic and simulation scenarios
- Pediatric Panda Bed Warmer, provides phototherapy for infants
- Pediatric Phototherapy Equipment, provides phototherapy for infants admitted to the hospital for elevated bilirubin levels
- Pediatric Transportation Assistance at OHMG Children's Center, provides transportation assistance to low-income families of pediatric patients
- Pulmonary Rehab Better Breathers
- Radiology Ultrasound Printers, enables radiology to provide Medicaid patients with a printout of baby's ultrasound
- Respiratory Therapy Aerobika Device
- Respiratory Therapy Intubation Head, allows respiratory therapists the ability to practice intubation within the unit
- Stop-the-Bleed Kits and Education, provides trauma kits that include: One C.A.T. Tourniquet, gloves, a QuikClot Bleeding control bandage, a compression bandage, a mini sharpie marker and a Save a Life booklet
- Surgical Care Dopplers
- Transitional Care/Rehab Car Transfer Program
- Transitional Care Patient Flower Delivery, provides weekly flowers to inpatients to lift their spirits during rehabilitation
- Vicki M. Stogsdill Nursing Award, provides a merit-based financial award for students completing a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing (BSN) through the University of Louisville School of Nursing-Owensboro
- Waitman C. Taylor, Jr. Hospitality Suites at Owensboro Health Regional Hospital, provide a temporary home away from home for families experiencing a medical crisis
