Some of these dog-themed stories deal with dogs that are very curious, smart and can do some amazing things. In the end, the dog characters each learn some amazing lessons. 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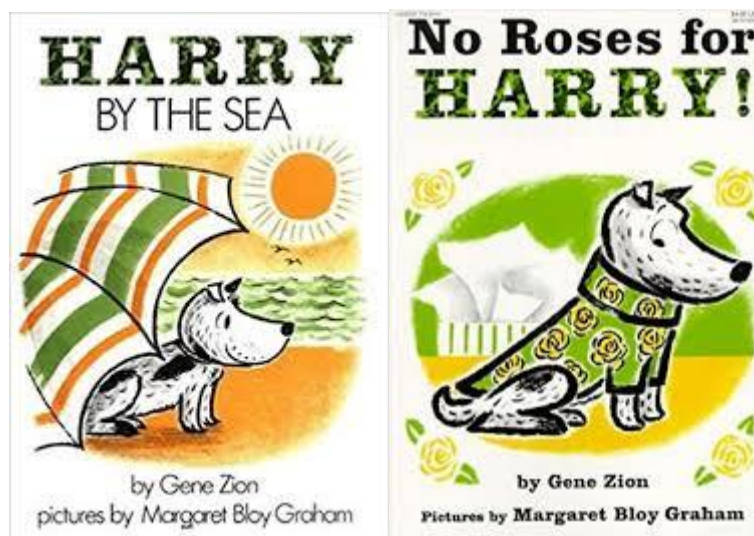
The first book is the story, *Harry the Dirty Dog* by Gene Zion



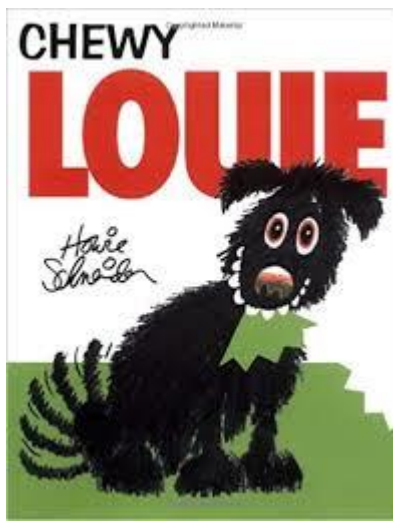

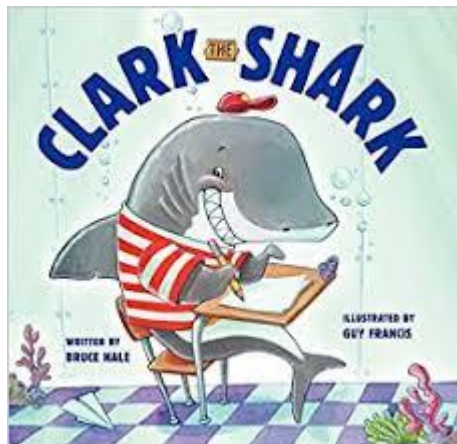
GRADE 2

Students will be introduced to fantasy/animal character stories as well as informational, factual informative books (Non-Fiction). Students will have continued practice navigating The World Book Online, eBook Database. Students will have practice in searching for materials and exploring the various types of books available to "read" online.


