2	Intro – Tagline <i>(5 to 30 sec)</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Clearly state the message of show; Represent show’s theme; Let’s audience know what to expect to hear; Represents the Host/Producer of the show through their voice; Depicts subject in an “enjoyable” way for listeners. 	This is “ <u>The Hooby-Dooby Podcast</u> ”, brought to you by _____. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Select a name.
1	Intro – Monologue or Multivoice <i>(15 to 45 sec)</i> Who are you? What are you going to talk about?	See script. <i>[Write script.]</i>
2	Show Content – Topic(s) <i>(5 to 15 minutes*)</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Content is everything! <small>* variable - some podcasts run an hour or more in length.</small>	Promote and celebrate. Persuade Share, review, and/or read Write and read stories, poems, facts, fiction, etc.
3	Closing Remarks <i>(30sec to 3 min)</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> End by thanking End by engaging listeners End by telling listeners where they can find more...if more to come! 	Thank the audience for listening; Thank everyone involved; Promote your podcast!
3	Intro/Content/Closing – Music <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Convey’s mood; Doesn’t overshadow voices; Helps to propel show and engage listeners. 	What music works with the feel of your show? What mood do you want listeners to be in when they listen to your show?
2	Mock-Commercials are FUN! <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Promotion Sponsorship Products 	Commercials for your library, makerspace, classroom, school, school teams, food in cafeteria, games on the playground, etc.
