Background information for the Graphic Design role

About the Information for Action Project

The Information for Action on Climate Change Project (I4A), an international collaboration of 8 organisations, has secured £75,000 from the VK Rasmussen Foundation to gather together the critical information that can lead people to direct action on climate change mitigation, adaptation and resilience. The core intention is to produce a website that will enable individuals and communities to identify and take simple actions that will lower their carbon output, sequester carbon, and help them live with the impacts of climate change. The project is building a sophisticated online platform that allows small scale solutions to be shared and accessed by a global audience, and to be rapidly adopted. Ultimately this website will enable practitioners to be more effective, engage new people and support national & regional networks to advocate and adopt evidence-based solutions.

Project goals

1. To help people understand their personal role and power in tackling climate change;
2. To collate permaculture based solutions to climate change in one online Knowledge Base;
3. To promote these solutions to new audiences;
4. To inspire action through the adoption of these solutions and increased education; and
5. To contribute to climate change mitigation, adaptation and carbon sequestration.

About the role

The I4A team have started to develop the key delivery mechanism for the project; online 'action' cards, each linked to a conventional webpage. We are now seeking an inspirational graphic designer to help us make the cards and web pages both visually stunning and easy to understand and navigate.

Core to the role will be creating the colour palette, topography, logos and icons for the cards and web pages. The graphic designer will work on the draft web pages and cards created by the web development team to improve layout and appearance and to create a strong 'look' for the project. They will also develop a logo for the project and a series of simple icons for categories such as water, energy, and resilience. On the following page is the latest draft version of one of the action cards which are at the core of the project, and which the Graphic Designer will work to improve and develop further.

The designer will produce a number of mood boards, (detailing card and page interfaces), a visually striking icon set, a logo, a comprehensive colour palette (colour-coded main sections), button design, and four suitable types faces. A style guide detailing RGB, CMYK and Hexadecimal colour codes is also required.

The work can all be done remotely, there is no need to attend the Permaculture Association offices in Leeds. The Graphic Designer will work online with other team members using google docs, email, skype and zoom. The role is a fixed term contract to deliver a single piece of work.



Make and Use Compost



Compost is a mixture of decayed garden and food waste that is used to build soil structure and feed plants. Dumping this waste into landfill would produce lots of methane, a major greenhouse gas, but good quality composting produces no methane. Moreover, adding compost to soil increases soil carbon, reducing carbon in the atmosphere.

About the Permaculture Association

The Permaculture Association is an education and research charity that supports individuals and groups to learn about and use permaculture.

Permaculture is an ecological design approach to creating sustainable settlements and systems. We offer a wide range of activities and services that support individuals and groups:

- The national office, which is based in Leeds, provides expert advice, networking contacts, information and support, via phone and email. Over 5000 enquiries are handled each year.
- The membership scheme works to inform, support and network between permaculture practitioners and groups in Britain. There are currently over 1400 members.
- Our quarterly print newsletter Permaculture Works gives updates on news, projects, and opportunities, and courses.
- We run a biennial convergence, a national diploma gathering, Annual General Meeting and other events. In September 2015 we hosted the 12th International Permaculture Convergence and Conference, which engaged 1200 people from 70 countries.

- We currently employ 21 part-time staff, some of whom work remotely and some of whom work at our office in Leeds. We are supported by regular volunteers from the Leeds area and a large number of supporters across the UK who help in a multitude of ways.
- We are an evolving organisation with a culture of trying out and adopting successful tools and systems to best deliver our work.
- The Chief Executive takes on day-to-day responsibility for the running of the charity.
- In addition, we have a number of working groups that focus on specific aspects of work.

About this contract

This is a fixed term contract for a freelance worker to deliver a specific piece of work. You will not be an employee of the Permaculture Association and will be responsible for your own tax and national insurance contributions and any other costs incurred in relation to this work, including bank charges for currency conversion where appropriate.

Title: Graphic Designer to the Information for Action on Climate Change Project

Salary and hours: £3,600. 15 days work (7.5 hours a day) at £240 per day.

Duration: Four months in early 2018. Ideally starting on 15th January, but this is negotiable.

Holiday entitlement: Fixed contract for defined delivery date.

Sickness provision: According to statutory requirements.

Job sharing: This post is not suitable for job sharing.

Place of work: This post is for remote working.
