“I have a small piece of land where I live, and beans have lasted two weeks. Today we just have a very small quantity of food left and that maybe can last through February”.

“More than 2 million people are currently affected by the floods in Burundi and the coping mechanisms people are using is to eat cassava leaves and the little food they can find. They also buy food on the markets, which is very expensive, prices have gone up in the past two months, so it’s very important for WFP and other agencies to be able to provide people with food aid very quickly now”.
