Note to Contestant: There are 5 mandatory maneuvers - Take off, Fly Past, Horizontal Figure Eight, Landing and Realism in Flight. Fill in these, **plus** your five optional maneuvers and/or scale operations below.

Also make sure that the maneuvers you have filled in below matches your flight score sheets **exactly**.

Spotter's Role:

- Read the current AMA/NASA Scale Rulebook and familiarize yourself with all the rules. Note that Spotters are referred to as "Helpers" in the rulebook.
- Guide the pilot out of harms way. Safety takes priority over everything!
- Give full attention to your pilot's flight, as you are working as a team. DO NOT be distracted by phones, texting, or talking with other people.
- Assist during start-up by restraining/attending to the plane before it takes to the runway.
- Assist in communicating with the Flight-line Boss (or Judges) as to your pilot's intentions so the pilot can quickly be cleared to use the runway.
- Advise the pilot when other aircraft/people might be in his/her flightpath.
- When calling out each of the maneuvers, use a calm voice.
