

Instructions for completing
Assent for Proving of Will in Common Form
(NHJB-2864-P)

Form use. This form is used to show that the interested parties who are listed in the court's case file agree with the proving of will in common form without the need for a witness to appear. By signing the assent form, the interested party agrees to the will being submitted and this allows the court to make a ruling on the document without the need for a witness to appear. It only applies to wills that are not being contested.

Top part of form

- COURT NAME:** Enter the name of the circuit court where the document will be filed. (example: 4th Circuit Court-Probate Division-Laconia; 10th Circuit Court-Probate Division-Brentwood).
- CASE NAME:** Enter the name of the deceased (example: Estate of John Adams; Estate of Susan Jones).
- CASE NUMBER:** Leave blank if not yet assigned by court OR fill in case number if it is known.

Main part of form

Check off the applicable boxes for each person who is assenting to the proving of will.

Each person signing the Assent form is indicating his or her agreement with the proving of the will in common form without the need for a witness to appear. Have each interested party sign on one of the lines in the second column. Each party's name should be printed below his or her signature and dated in the appropriate space to the left. Enter each party's complete mailing address, including zip code, in the "Address" column.

Review the completed form for accuracy prior to filing it with the court. If completing this form on-line, some fields may be filled in automatically based on entries in other fields. If more space is needed for any question, please attach additional sheets of paper.
