

Reports

ACER will provide a standard list of reports at class level (List of Student Scores reports, Individual Profile Narrative reports and Group Summary reports)

CogAT results can be interpreted through Data Manager if schools use ACER's test scoring services to mark the *CogAT* answer sheets. Data Manager allows teachers to produce customised reports for their student population.

Riverside DataManager™ web reporting keys are access codes to the assessment results of groups of students at locations throughout a school. Much like a house key provides the ability to unlock the front door of a house, a web reporting key provides the ability to unlock a location in DataManager and view the assessment results of students associated with that location (school).

For each Building Identification Sheet processed, a reporting key is created that provides access to view the test results of the students whose answer documents were submitted under that identification sheet. Summary reports are also provided for that group of students, as well as the group of students submitted under each Grade/Class Identification Sheet.

The process for providing individuals with access to reports is as follows:

- The Account Holder (Teacher) at the school receives an e-mail from Riverside® announcing that the reporting keys are available for distribution to users.
- The Account Holder distributes reporting keys to report users (if applicable).
