- ** Non-satisfactory grades for financial aid purposes include I's (incomplete), T's (audit), Y's or UW's (unofficial withdrawal), W's (official withdrawal), X's or WX's (non-attendance/participation), N's, NG's or blanks (no grade reported), U's (unsatisfactory), NP's (not proficient), IP's (in progress), UP's (unsatisfactory progress), I/F's (failed incomplete), IP/F's (failed in progress), and F's (failing grade). Non-satisfactory grades on a 99DEFAULT audit may show 0.0 hours, and you will need to know the original hours for the course to include in your total. You will have to also determine actual grades from your grade report for any special grades used from the degree audit legend. Other grades not listed here are considered satisfactory.
