Funding for the first semester will be issued based on **estimated** pre-study income for students who have applied and been assessed prior to the start date of their first semester. To receive any additional funding, students must confirm their pre-study income using the Income Confirmation Form (ICF).

Applications received but not assessed prior to the first day of classes require an ICF to process the application.

For students who applied after the start date of the first semester, an ICF is not required.

StudentAidNL must receive the ICF within 8 weeks of the period of study start date.

- The ICF must be submitted on or after the first day of classes.
- Failure to submit the ICF may result in provincial grants being converted to a **repayable interest-free provincial loan**
