In a biography, an author tells the story of someone else's life.

Your assignment: select a biography book about someone that interests you. This person should have qualities that you admire. Books must be approved by _____.

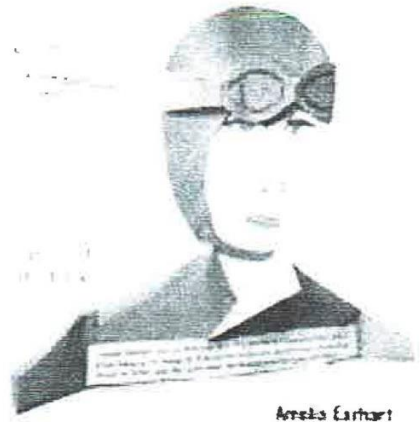
Then complete the following:

1. **Biography Hanger:** Create a biography hanger that depicts what your person looks like and include 3 objects that represent the person you chose. Write an explanation of each object on an index card. Write the explanation in the first person, as if you are the person you read about. You will be presenting these items in your presentation.
2. **Presentation:** Dress up as the person you read about and present a five minute speech discussing the following information. This speech should be given as if you were the person you read about. (Ex. My name is George Washington...) you may use index cards to present during your speech.
 - A. Introduce yourself and give a brief history (date of birth, where you were born, where did you grow up, & family life)
 - B. What are your personality traits?
 - C. What were your major accomplishments, why is there a book written about you?
 - D. What conflicts or obstacles did you face in your life?
 - E. Explain and introduce items on your biography hanger.

Biography Hanger Directions:

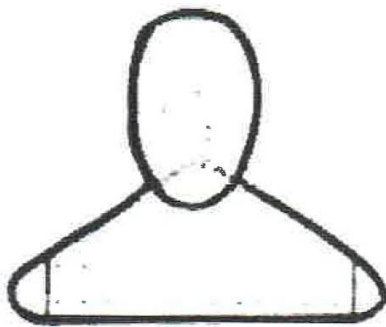
Materials:

1. Wire hanger (thin ones work best)
2. Large piece of construction paper (Provided)
3. Heavy duty tape
4. Scissors
5. Index cards
6. String
7. Hole punch



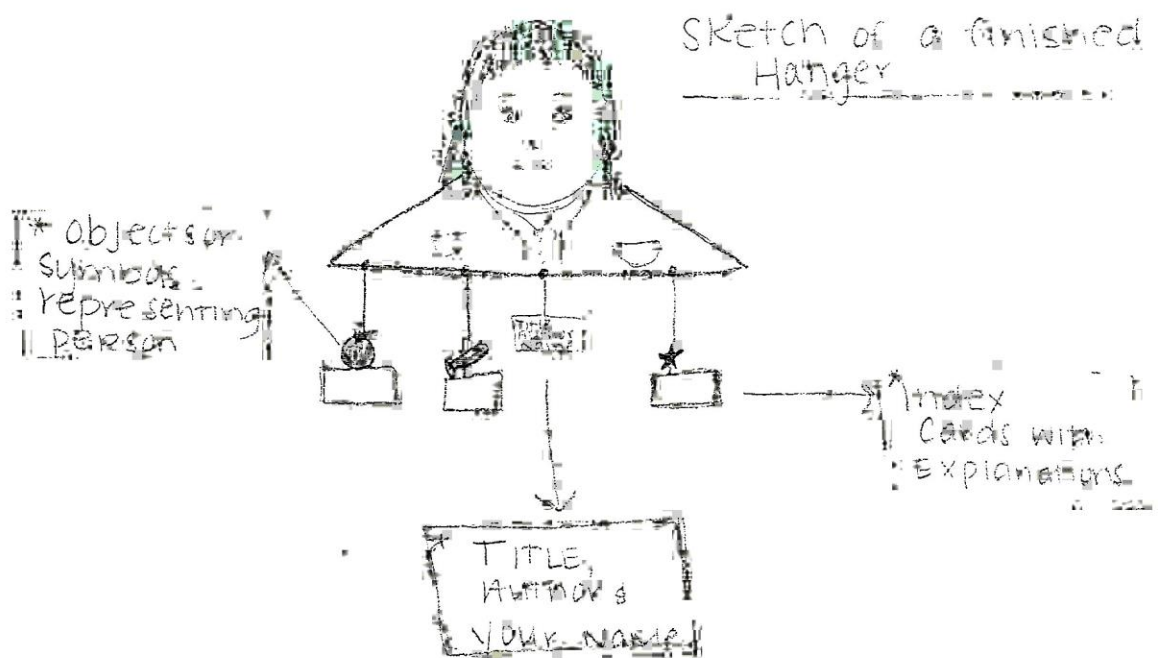
Directions for Assembling:

1. Center a hanger on the large piece of paper construction paper. Be sure the hook extends over the top edge.
2. Fold the paper along the angle to cover the "shoulder" wires.
3. Use tape to secure the paper.
4. Turn the covered hanger over (This piece represents an upper torso.)
5. Cut out a circle or oval about 4 or 5 inches in diameter.
6. Tape the circle onto the top of the hanger. (This piece represents a head.)
7. Decorate or "dress," the piece to resemble a person.



Once Assembled:

1. Write the title, author, and your name on an index card
2. Choose 3 objects or symbols that represent something important about the person you read about. Draw a picture or find a picture of the object and attach it to your hanger with string.
3. For each object you must write an explanation describing why it is important on an index card. Don't just tell what the object is, **EXPLAIN** why it is important! Attach this with string underneath the picture of your object.

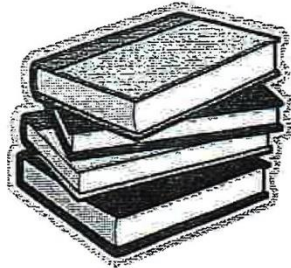


Examples of Biography Hangers before the index cards are attached
