| <p><b>Format:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Simple in design</li> <li>• Clear focus on the main task</li> <li>• Organized in such a way that key information is easy to locate</li> </ul>  |  |                   |
| <p><b>Purpose:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Includes learning outcomes that are written in language that can be understood by students</li> <li>• Explains how the assignment connects to the course learning outcomes</li> <li>• Explains how the knowledge and skills gained by completing this assignment will be important in students' lives. If possible, expand beyond the assignment to the course, program, career, and beyond</li> <li>• Provides the information needed to frame an excellent response (e.g., receive an A)</li> </ul>   |  |                   |
| <p><b>Task:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The task or activity is easy to identify and understand</li> <li>• Guiding questions are included (see link):<br/> <a href="http://www.asainstitute.org/conference2013/handouts/20-Bloom-Question-Cues-Chart.pdf">http://www.asainstitute.org/conference2013/handouts/20-Bloom-Question-Cues-Chart.pdf</a></li> <li>• Steps, guidelines, or a recommended sequence of activities is included, if applicable</li> <li>• What <b>not to do</b> is included, if applicable (for example, critical mistakes to be avoided)</li> <li>• The task is engaging for students (involves current events, topics of interest)</li> <li>• Task-related questions are anticipated and addressed</li> <li>• Opportunity for formative feedback is provided</li> <li>• Task is intentionally linked to other assignments</li> <li>• The format of the final deliverable and how it is to be submitted is clearly stated</li> <li>• Resources needed (articles, software, data sets, equipment, supplies) and how to access them are explained</li> </ul> |  |                   |
| <p>Suggestion: If information is purposely excluded, a statement of explanation should be included (For example: "The purpose of this assignment is for you to come up with your own original solution.")</p>   |  |                   |
| <p><b>Grading:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Grading criteria is included</li> <li>• Grading criteria is specific and includes expectations, rubrics, or scoring guidelines</li> <li>• Explains how the assignment grade contributes to the overall course grade</li> <li>• Characteristics of a quality finished product are included</li> <li>• Submission deadline is clearly stated</li> <li>• Grading questions are anticipated (e.g., due date extensions)</li> </ul>  |  |                   |
