Criteria		Comments/Feedback
Format: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Simple in design Clear focus on the main task Organized in such a way that key information is easy to locate 		
Purpose: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Includes learning outcomes that are written in language that can be understood by students Explains how the assignment connects to the course learning outcomes Explains how the knowledge and skills gained by completing this assignment will be important in students' lives. If possible, expand beyond the assignment to the course, program, career, and beyond Provides the information needed to frame an excellent response (e.g., receive an A) 		
Task: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The task or activity is easy to identify and understand Guiding questions are included (see link): http://www.asainstitute.org/conference2013/handouts/20-Bloom-Question-Cues-Chart.pdf Steps, guidelines, or a recommended sequence of activities is included, if applicable What not to do is included, if applicable (for example, critical mistakes to be avoided) The task is engaging for students (involves current events, topics of interest) Task-related questions are anticipated and addressed Opportunity for formative feedback is provided Task is intentionally linked to other assignments The format of the final deliverable and how it is to be submitted is clearly stated Resources needed (articles, software, data sets, equipment, supplies) and how to access them are explained 		
Suggestion: If information is purposely excluded, a statement of explanation should be included (For example: "The purpose of this assignment is for you to come up with your own original solution.")		
Grading: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Grading criteria is included Grading criteria is specific and includes expectations, rubrics, or scoring guidelines Explains how the assignment grade contributes to the overall course grade Characteristics of a quality finished product are included Submission deadline is clearly stated Grading questions are anticipated (e.g., due date extensions) 		
Suggestion: If there is not a rubric, provide a checklist of characteristics of successful work.
